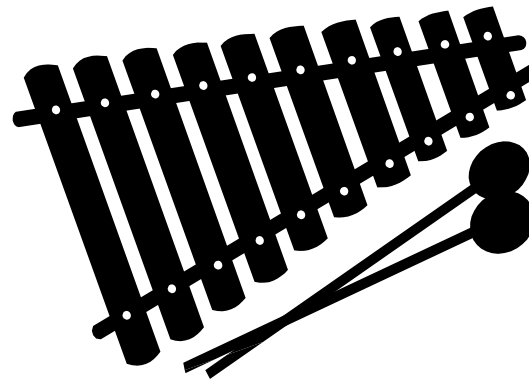

About the Courses

Level I will introduce participants to the fundamentals of the Orff approach. Instruction will cover Orff techniques, including the ostinato, pentatonic scale, simple bordun accompaniments, rhythmic and melodic training, improvisation and elemental forms. The daily program will include 3 hours of pedagogy, one hour of soprano recorder, seventy minutes of basic movement, and one hour of special topics. Level II will also include alto recorder and a more in-depth study of pedagogy including I-V orchestrations. These courses meet the guidelines set forth by the American Orff Schulwerk Association. Upon successful completion of the course, applicants will receive the appropriate Certification.

Prerequisite: Level I is for anyone with the ability to read music who wishes to acquire basic knowledge and pedagogic foundations in the Orff-Schulwerk approach. Level II is for teachers successfully completing a Level I certification. **Proof of Level I certification is necessary.**

Course Requirements: - 100% attendance; Participation in all activities; Successful completion of all written assignments.

Materials: A list will be provided for required texts, and materials. These items will be available for purchase at the course.

Housing: We encourage you to immerse yourself in Orff Schulwerk. Plan to stay in our university housing for the best experience. Housing is limited and assigned on a first come/first serve basis. Please inquire as to availability. Meals are not included but are available on-campus.

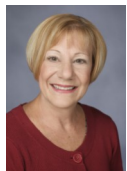
Faculty:

Sue Mueller, BM, University of Kansas, MM, Lesley College, Orff Schulwerk Level I-III, masters class certification, taught K-5 music in Las Vegas, Nevada, for 25 years until her appointment as Assistant Professor of Music Education for University of Las Vegas, Nevada. An active presenter for AOSA chapters and national conferences, MENC state and local meetings, Sue also teaches Level I pedagogy in the UNLV Teacher Training Course where she previously taught recorder for 14 years. She served on the National Board of Trustees of the American Orff-Schulwerk Association for ten years and is a recent past President.
